

No extension of the right to request time to train

The right to request time to train has been available to employees of organisations employing at least 250 people for almost a year (please see our article 'A new right to request time to train' for further information).

The right was due to be extended to employees of smaller organisations next month. However, the Government has recently announced that it is delaying this to ensure that 'the right balance is struck between support for training and the need to minimise the burden of regulation for smaller companies'.
